Unfortunately, the editorial concept was soon weakened by the publisher's overriding interest in commercial viability and the planned 108 issues were cut back to 84, squeezing the end of the alphabet. People with no knowledge of, or sympathy for,

philately were drafted in to rewrite copy so as to “tighten it up”. Inevitably, this arbitrary action led to criticism in the contemporary philatelic press ...

A work of recent date is recommended for its content and the exceptional clarity of presentation. It is:

Logan, Kenneth C. *Dictionary of World Stamps: Philatelic Atlas of the World*. Leicester: Galley Press, 1987. 94pp.

The compiler is a professional cartographer who treats continents on a historical basis. Boxed notes surrounding each outline map are arrowed to the countries and towns that have issued stamps. The dictionary of the title is a gazetteer indexing the maps, with notes on the political history and postal consequences. Full colour is used throughout.

English-Italian and Italian-English. An outstanding model in utility for speakers of both languages. Comprehensive dictionaries with supplementary lists covering: special English terms; terms and abbreviations in English and Italian postmarks and for general use; typographical terms; confusing place names in Italian. An essay on understanding colour descriptions is specially valuable. Future compilers of glossaries are recommended to study this booklet from a leading student and author closely.

A list of French terms with equivalents in English, German, Italian, Portuguese and Spanish. Appears to be reissued periodically to update the list of members, though the vocabularies are unchanged. Two editions have been seen: one from the 1980s and another in 1995.

Bierman, Dr. Stanley M. *The World's Greatest Stamp Collectors*. First published New York: Frederick Fell, 1981. 312pp. (Reviewed PLR 30/107.) Reprinted Sidney OH: Linn's Stamp News, 1990. 232pp.

Bierman, Dr. Stanley M. *More of the World's Greatest Stamp Collectors*. Sidney OH: Linn's Stamp News, 1990. 232pp.

These volumes are designed to give “insight into the personalities of great philatelists and glimpses at the contents of their wondrous collections”. The biographical narratives are supported by extensive literature references, portraits and an index. The first book is of such legendary figures worldwide as Ferrary, Caspary, Burrus and Tapling; the second concentrates on leading American collectors of 1890-1950. The works are entertaining and highly original.

Butler, A.Ronald. *The History of the Roll of Distinguished Philatelists*. London: British Philatelic Federation, 1990. 224pp.

This most valuable book tells how the Roll was established, reconstructing its early history for permanent record, and describes how the Roll is administered. Then follow biographies and portraits of the signatories, 1921-89, totalling over 250 men and women. Butler himself, an RDP in 1975, appears at p.161. As he has honoured my present work with a Foreword, I feel keen regret in noting that his meticulous *History* was greatly marred in its typesetting.

*Rewrite existing entry for Blue Book as*

*The Blue Book of Philately: Who's Who in the Stamp World*. New York: H.L.Lindquist. 1st edn., 1935, 404pp.; 2nd edn., 1938, 434pp.

There are brief particulars of about 5000, predominantly U.S., collectors with indexes to their location and specialities. Commendably, several hundred small portrait photographs are included. Editor Lindquist found the labour of compilation too great to produce further editions. This mirrored the experience of *Rogers' American Philatelic Blue Book* (New York: Albert R.Rogers, 1893, 280pp.), in whose single edition this stamp broker advised "never undertake to get up a book like this: I promise not to do so again". His minutely detailed tabulation of 2000 collectors and dealers, a marvel of Victorian typesetting, contains numerous fascinating advertisements.

Tyler, Varro E. *Philatelic Forgers: Their Lives and Works*. 1st edn. London: Robson Lowe, 1976. 64pp.; 2nd [termed "revised"] edn. Sidney OH: Linn's Stamp News, 1991. 176pp.

Dr. Tyler presents painstakingly researched and fully referenced biographies of more people than the title might suggest. Cogently argued, this marshalling of historical fact allows informed assessments to be made of the characters named.

Robinson, [Prof.] Doris. *Stamps, Coins, Postcards & Related Materials*. New York: The Peri Press, 1990. 168pp.

An extremely detailed guide is presented with great professional polish to both general and specialised English-language periodicals. Indexes allow information on title, publisher, organisation, subject and ISBN to be found.

Danzig was told that Garratt-Adams "had spent £5000 on journals and books from the Harris library and stock. Harris had bought numerous libraries including those of Vallancey and Bacon, tracing the line all the way to Bellamy". The date of the purchase given Danzig was "about 1955", but the above date (1948) is probably more accurate. Hayes, writing as mentioned in 1980, clearly had in mind the fact that Garratt-Adams still hoarded much of this literature stock.

The 1951 Congress glossary was a descendant of earlier versions, long out of print. A draft was first prepared as: *A Glossary of Philatelic Terms* compiled for submission to The Third Philatelic Congress of Great Britain, 1911 by the following Committee: E.D.Bacon, W.Dorning Beckton, P.C.Bishop, E.B.Evans, L.W.Fulcher, F.J.Melville, C.J.Phillips. Appointed by the Second Philatelic Congress of Great Britain, 1910. This 16pp. pamphlet (bearing the vast title) was probably circulated in 1911. It was extensively revised and Stanley Gibbons then published it for Congress as the 28-page version in 1912. An additional name appears there among the committee of compilers, F.A.Bellamy, and all individuals concerned were eminent in philatelic-literature matters. As mentioned earlier (item 3 of *Philatelic Glossaries* in Chapter 17), E.B.Evans also bound this 1912 *Glossary* in with his own book *Stamps and Stamp Collecting* when Gibbons published it the following year, 1913. In the U.K. Birch deposited copies of his translation with the British Library Philatelic Collections and in the libraries of the Royal and National Philatelic Societies. In the U.S.A. copies went to the American and the Western Philatelic Research Libraries and the libraries of the Collectors Clubs in New York and Chicago. Birch specifically waived copyright in his translation, intending it "for the free use of the philatelic community". A confused note in *Philatelic Quill* Vol.7 (Apr 1991) p.50, however, suggests this breached the original publisher's copyright, who consequently will not allow any further copies to be produced.
